


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Sustainable Youth Ministry

Mark DeVries



Dietrich Bonhoeffer



Cameron Cole and Jon Nielson



Colin Bennett



Mark Yaconelli



Janet Batsleer



Rebooted: Reclaiming Youth Ministry for the Long Haul


Tim Gough


Lead Them to Jesus: A Handbook for Youth Workers Mike McGarry

Thanks for the Feedback Sheila Heen and Douglas Stone


